BEACON HILL REPORT by Thomas Joyce, Esq.

The Massachusetts Legislature concluded the 2017 formal sessions the third Wednesday in November, and will meet twice weekly in informal sessions until January. During these informal sessions, the House and Senate can take actions on bills, including enactment, as long as there is no objection.

Unfortunately, I need to report that notwithstanding the conclusion of formal sessions there has been tremendous political turmoil and intrigue over the last ten days. After shocking news broke alleging improprieties by the spouse of Senate President Stanley Rosenberg, Stan voluntarily resigned his role as President, and after ten hours of a legislative caucus, Senate Majority Leader Harriet L. Chandler of Worcester was unanimously elected as Acting President.

The Senate then instructed their Ethics Committee to undertake an investigation taking the unprecedented step of hiring an outside investigator to look into the matter. To be sure, this has put a dark cloud over the golden dome on Beacon Hill. Furthermore, not less than four Senators have taken the unusual step to announce their campaigns to be elected Senate President if Senator Rosenberg is not reelected to that post at the conclusion of the investigation. I should probably note that Attorney General Maura Healey and Suffolk County District Attorney Dan Conley have reportedly launched their own criminal investigations into Senator Rosenberg's spouse.

On a much brighter note, just last week, Auditor Bump has announced the beginning of her reelection campaign. She has been a good friend of the Association, always willing to discuss our concerns.

Also last week, in the special Senate election to replace former Senator Jennifer Flanagan, republican Fitchburg City Councilor Dean Tran won the special election besting the democratic candidate by more than 600 votes. When he is sworn in by Governor Charlie Baker the Senate will have

seven republicans. Coincidentally, Representative elect Tran is the first Vietnamese American Senator in Massachusetts history, having fled Vietnam as a child.

On the legislative front, most joint committees including the Election Laws committee have heard all bills in their respective committees and by rule must report on them by the first Wednesday in February. I am working hard to ensure that any bills enacted by the legislature are in our interest and include matters important to the MTCA.

As reported before, Governor Charlie Baker has for the second time this year vetoed legislation creating Community Investment Districts. As passed, the proposed law would require Clerks to investigate and report on matters not within your purview.

With voter registration being actively discussed in the legislature, you may note that the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court has agreed to hear a case where the 20-day election registration cutoff has been held illegal by a lower court.

I will keep you updated as public policy issues progress. I wish all of you a very happy holiday season and a wonderful New Year!

Year-end campaign finance report reminder from OCPF

We get a lot of questions about the year-end campaign finance report during the holiday season, so we hope you find the following information helpful.

The year-end report is due Jan. 22, 2018 (Jan. 20, the statutory due date, falls on a Saturday). The beginning date of the year-end report is the day after the ending date on the last report until Dec. 31.

For example, if a candidate filed a post-election report 30 days after the 2017 spring election, and the ending date on the report was May 17, the year-end report period would be from May 18 until Dec. 31. If a candidate was not on the ballot this year, the report period covers the entire year.

Who files the year-end report? Every candidate and committee files the year-end report.

This includes all office-holders (incumbents) whether they were on the ballot this year or not, as well as non-incumbents with a balance, financial activity or liabilities.

Candidates and committees can use the M102 form to file the year-end report.

Please send a notice to your filers in early January with the due date and reporting periods (it can be sent by mail or e-mail).


