## **BEACON HILL REPORT** by Thomas Joyce, Esq.

Congratulations to all for a successful conference at Devens. Kudos in particular to Association President Andy Dowd for successfully securing our Lieutenant Governor, Karen Polito to be the featured speaker at Thursday's luncheon. A dynamic speech, Lieutenant Governor Polito wasted no time in congratulating Clerks on the critical job you do and wished you success in the upcoming elections. As a former State Representative from Shrewsbury, she demonstrated a firm grasp of your multiple tasks and the tremendous contribution you make to municipal government and all your residents.

I had the pleasure to briefly address you at the luncheon as well. I was very pleased to inform you that the electronic poll book legislation is on the move in the House, having been one of only a few bills reported favorably by the Joint Committee on Election Laws for action this legislative session.

As noted by Lieutenant Governor Polito at the luncheon, Governor Charlie Baker has filed House 2 his 2017 fiscal budget proposal for consideration by the House Ways & Means Committee. House Ways & Means then will recommend its version to the full House for action in April.

I was happy to report that it was the first Governor's budget in years that did not include language creating a secure vital records trust fund. Although this issue may need to be addressed in the House or Senate budget proposals, the MTCA Legislative Committee and I will watch this very closely.

Coincidentally, on the day of the Devens luncheon, the Senate debated and passed its version of Public Records Reform. That bill, along with the earlier passed House bill, is now before a six member Conference Committee to work out the differing versions. Please note that we were successful in making the proposals more user friendly for town clerks.

Also last week, the Joint Committee on Municipalities and Regional Government heard House Bill 3906, the Governor's bill (in part), to modernize municipal government and finance. President Dowd offered a statement supporting the bill particularly the sections he had asked the Administration to include relative to elections. Considering there are 4 other related bills to be heard, I do not expect immediate action.

On the progress of another matter, I have been working with Representative Peter Kocot on advancing House Bill 2794 that would remove "children born out of wedlock" from the restricted vital records list. I hope to have some news on this shortly.

Lastly, by the time I pen my contribution to this publication next month, the Legislature by rule will have reported on or extended the time on which to report, thousands of bills currently in the several committees. I look forward to more good news at that time.

#### **MEMBERSHIP DEFINITIONS**

BD15-16

#### FULL MEMBER

Full members are Municipal Clerks, City Secretaries, Recorders, Legislative Administrators and Directors of Corporate Services and/or an individual who serves a Legislative Government Body (LGB) in an administrative capacity with management responsibilities and whose duties include four of the following: • General Management • Records Management • Elections • Meeting Administration • Management of by-laws, Articles of Incorporation, ordinances or other legal instruments • Human Resources Management • Financial Management • Custody of the official seal and execution of official documents.

#### ADDITIONAL FULL MEMBER

Additional Full Members are fully qualified members from the same organization. This would essentially be Deputy Clerks within the same City, but could be other individuals provided they would qualify under the definition of Full Member. A city must have one Full Member before they would be eligible to have Additional Full Members.

#### ASSOCIATE MEMBER

Associate Members are individuals serving a legislative body in a capacity not previously defined. In other words if someone serving a legislative body does not qualify for Full Membership they would be able to join as an Associate Member. Associate members DO NOT have the right to vote, hold office or obtain certification, but they can take advantage of education programs and should they eventually assume the job of Clerk or Deputy, they could then apply for certification. A Full Member who is in transition (between jobs) would automatically become an Associate Member until they reassume the position of Clerk. Associate members would also pay a lower fee.

#### CORPORATE MEMBER

Corporate Members are those companies that find it advantageous to be affiliated with IIMC. They would not have any voting rights nor could they hold office or be certified.

#### 2016 NEW ENGLAND MUNICIPAL CLERK INSTITUTE & ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- The Executive Board shall determine, annually, the amount of scholarship monies to be allocated. Scholarships are only for those applicants who have been denied funds from their municipalities.
- The Joint Scholarship Committee shall consist of a committee made up of members appointed by the President of the New England Association of City & Town Clerks and the Chair of the NEMCI & Academy Board of Directors.
- Scholarship money from both sources shall be combined and allocated to applicants as agreed by the committee, with the excep tion of funds specifically earmarked and in the possession of the New England Municipal Clerks Institute & Academy Board of Directors.
- 4. The NEACTC President appoints a Joint Scholarship Chairman to serve for three years.
- 5. Scholarships shall be awarded to students attending the New England Municipal Clerks Institute and Academy.
- Scholarship awards will be limited to one person per office with the Clerk having first preference. 6.
- 7. Applicant must be a Municipal Clerk or Deputy/Assistant Clerk.
- 8. The Joint Scholarship Committee will give priority to first year Institute students.
- 9. An applicant must be a current member of his or her state association.
- 10. An applicant must have been a member of the NEACTC for over one year.
- Applicant shall disclose at time of application they have applied for IIMC funds. 11.
- 12. An applicant must have requested funds from his/her municipality and include a letter of denial for such funds.
- ١. Applicants should (after denial from municipality) send this application to their state association for funding. A reason for denial or explanation must accompany this application in order to be considered.
- 2. Deadline to file applications with the State Scholarship Chair is April 8, 2016.
- 3. Joint Scholarship Chair will notify the applicant, the Treasurer of the NEACTC, and the Treasurer of the NEMCI & Academy by April 30, 2016.
