# **BEACON HILL REPORT** by Thomas Joyce, Esq.

The Constitutional Convention in joint session met on May 8<sup>th</sup>, only long enough to recess until October. The proposed constitutional amendments, particularly S12 filed by Senate President Murray, dealing with allowing no excuse absentee voting was not acted upon, but may be taken up in the fall. We will be closely monitoring any activity.

Also, the Joint Committee on Election Laws has not yet acted on any of the Election Law reform bills before it. We have been working very closely with Co-Chairmen Murphy and Finegold to advance our agenda. Although only two of our bills have been heard we are stressing the desire to attach our agenda items to any favorable bill the Committee may advance. We are hopeful that if any reform bill moves out of committee it will be in a form the MTCA can actively support. I will keep you posted.

On May 4<sup>th</sup> the Governor filed his fifth supplemental budget proposal of the year H3436. You may recall that H49 a supplemental filed earlier this year contains a provision providing for a surcharge on vital records to support the state registry. The bill filed this month calls for \$120Million to support a number of items including snow and ice removal, and most importantly for us, it includes \$12Million for funding the special Senate election to be concluded on June 25<sup>th</sup>. I have been working with the Ways & Means Chairman on both of these issues.

I was pleased to testify at the Election Law Committee hearing in favor of a number of proposals including S322, An Act relative to Election Officers, allowing clerks an additional measure of control in assigning a smaller number of officials at the polls if deemed appropriate; H574, An Act relative to primary elections to comply with Federal regulations. Additionally, I urged the committee to replace S331 requiring risk based audits, with the association task force legislation to study the issue. Accompanied on a panel by Joe Powers and Kathleen Nagle we also testified in favor of two of MTCA agenda bills, special election reimbursement and a bill limiting the usage of "street lists."

June 19th the Committee on Election Laws will be

conducting a public hearing on 26 bills dealing with voter rights and participation. I suspect much of the testimony will focus on bills providing for online voter registration, permanent registration for voters who move within the Commonwealth, preregistration of voters and registration of 17 year olds for Presidential primary elections. The association Legislative Committee is currently preparing for the hearing.

The Massachusetts House of Representatives has set three special elections for September 10<sup>th</sup>, to fill vacancies in Fall River, Worcester and Dorchester. Worcester and Fall River became vacant by resignation and the Dorchester seat became vacant with the election of Linda Dorcena Forry to the state Senate.

The legislature, while conducting hearings and other important business, is occupied with conference committees working around the clock to find compromise on the differing versions of the transportation tax bill and the 2014 fiscal state budget. We can expect final action on these two vital bills within the next 2 weeks.

### MTCA CERTIFICATION EXAM (CMMC) IN JULY

The MTCA examination for Certified Massachusetts Municipal Clerk (CMMC) designation will be offered in July. Applications must be received by Administrator Barbara LaBombard by **JUNE 30<sup>th</sup>** for the July exam, which will be mailed between July 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Applicants must have at least **three years** experience as <u>Town Clerk</u> and must complete a minimum of six required courses sponsored by the MTCA.

The Administrator will verify the courses through the Education Committee. More information is available in the certification program brochure.

Completed exams must be postmarked no later than August 25<sup>th</sup> for the July exam. Applicants are <u>strongly</u> urged to return the completed answer sheets by <u>certified mail</u>, return receipt requested.

Applicants will be notified by mail of the results of their exams by September 15<sup>th</sup>. A copy of the notification must be submitted with the application for MTCA certification. The notification of successful completion of the exam will be valid for one year and

will have an expiration date printed on it. If an applicant is not certified within one year, the test must be repeated.

The passing score for the exam is 80. Applicants are advised that they will need access to an updated copy of the Massachusetts General Laws to complete the exam successfully.

A non-refundable fee of \$50.00, made payable to the MTCA, must be submitted with the application. This examination is offered twice yearly – during the months of January and July. Application forms for the examination are available from the administrator, Barbara LaBombard. 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# OPEN MEETING LAW OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

The Open Meeting Law Guide was revised in March 2013; the new version is on our website

There are three checklists, on the topics of notices, executive session procedures, and meeting minutes, that were also posted to the website in March 2013

Two (fairly) recent decisions of note:

♦ OML 2013-9 — Noting that, when the only business to be discussed during an open session is the procedural requirements for entering executive session, public bodies should list "open session" on the meeting notice, in addition to the executive session topic, so that

members of the public know the public body will, in fact, hold an open meeting that they are permitted to attend.

♦ OML 2013-44 – Noting that if a notice is revised, the revised notice must conspicuously record on or with the notice both the date and time the original notice was posted as well as the date and time the last revision was posted.



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
