reetings! A good number of Massachusetts Clerks attended the New England Association of City and Town Clerks (NEACTC) conference last week in beautiful Woodstock, VT. The Vermont Clerks put on a great conference, which included stimulating education sessions, good food, and a tour of Billings Farm. Many of us had a chance to reconnect with NEMCI classmates and enjoy fellowship with our Clerks friends from around New England.

Congratulations to MTCA Treasurer Bob Cutler who was sworn in as NEACTC President! Bob and the NEACTC 2016 conference committee are busy preparing to host the New England conference in Boston next year. Please mark your calendars, the conference will be held November $15^{th} - 17^{th}$ 2016 (Tuesday – Thursday), at the Omni Parker House in Boston.

Our Legislative Committee and Lobbyist continue to monitor legislation that will impact Clerks. The Public Records Bill was reported out of Ways & Means and will be debated on the House floor very shortly. We have successfully influenced changes to this Bill which will make it easier to implement. As I previously mentioned, this Bill has extremely strong support from a variety of sources. Simply opposing this legislation was not a viable option. Like it or not, updates to the Public Records Law are needed, working behind the scenes to effect practical changes was our best option.

Early Voting is now less than 1 year The Secretary of the Commonwealth is developing early voting regulations. Many Clerks are waiting for this information as they finalize their FY17 budget requests. I have spoken with Michelle Tassinari several times regarding progress on draft regulations. Their goal is to simplify the process as much as possible. Because early voting is in addition to absentee voting (a constitutional right), the intent is mirror the procedures wherever possible. As you prepare your FY17 budgets, I would suggest you include the costs of using election workers to assist during the early voting period (10 days). Keep in mind, you are not required to have a police officer present or hire election workers. We are obligated to offer early voting during regular hours, if you choose to offer additional evening or weekend hours, budget accordingly.

BEACON HILL REPORT by Thomas Joyce, Esq.

Congratulations on successfully conducting another election. MTCA Clerks do such a seemingly transparent, yet incredible job running elections that it is so often taken for granted. To be certain, this is a story that association leadership, your legislative committee and I convey to legislative leaders on Beacon Hill.

In addition to the number of municipal offices filled, the Legislature saw three of its members elected to new positions. Representative Michael Brady (D) of Brocton ran a successful campaign to win the Senate seat vacated due to the death of former Senator Thomas Kennedy. Also, Republican Senator Robert Hedlund defeated the incumbent Mayor of Weymouth to fill that position while Representative Stephen DiNatale (D) of Fitchburg was the victor in that mayoral election. The soon to be open House seats will see primary elections in March concurring with the Commonwealth's Presidential primary.

Although the legislature has been busy conducting numerous public hearings on a whole host of issues since I reported last, a handful of major bills have been sent to the Governor and signed. Perhaps, most importantly, is a final supplemental budget to close the books for last year. Importantly, although heavily lobbied, there was no language included for the creation of a secure vital records trust fund to be funded via fees to be collected by Clerks. This may be seen as a setback for the Department of Public Health that you will recall as recently as your meeting at Sea Crest, representatives were instructing you on its forthcoming administration.

A few weeks ago, the Joint Committee on Election Laws heard two MTCA legislative proposals. I was pleased to testify on House Bill 583 and House Bill 584 dealing with voter status, and a change in the primary date for statewide elections. Although no significant bills have yet to be

reported by this Committee I will let you know the moment any bills move.

It is widely expected that this week the House Ways & Means Committee will finalize the public records bill and report it to the House for consideration. We have proposed a few minor changes that will make it easier to administer the bill should it become law. Comparatively, the Mass Municipal Association and some other organizations such as the ACLU have taken very hard line positions on the proposal. Interestingly, the Secretary of the Commonwealth, while urging passage of the bill, has at the same time initiated a state ballot referendum on the subject. If the question is to appear on the ballot approximately 64,000 additional signatures must be filed by close of business Wednesday.

I will update you as things unfold this week. In the meantime, I wish you and your families a very happy and meaningful Thanksgiving, particularly in light of the most recent horrific tragedy in Paris.

I foresee early voting to be absentee voting on steroids. The predictions are that we will see the highest volume during the last few days. Once the regulations are finalized, we will request a full review by the State Auditor to determine if a mandate exists.

As we get ready to celebrate Thanksgiving, I hope all of you thoroughly enjoy time spent with family and friends along with a little extra time off from work.



MTCA CERTIFICATION EXAM (CMMC) IN JANUARY

The MTCA examination for Certified Massachusetts Municipal Clerk (CMMC) designation will be offered in January. Applications must be received by Administrator Barbara LaBombard by **DECEMBER 15th** for the January exam, which will be mailed between January 1st and January 7th

Applicants must have at least **three years** experience as <u>Town Clerk</u> and must complete a minimum of six required courses sponsored by the MTCA.

The Administrator will verify the courses through the Education Committee. More information is available in the certification program brochure.

Completed exams must be postmarked no later than February 10th for the January exam. Applicants are <u>strongly</u> urged to return the completed answer sheets by <u>certified mail</u>, return receipt requested.

Applicants will be notified by mail of the results of their exams by March 1st. A copy of the notification must be submitted with the application for MTCA certification. The notification of successful completion of the exam will be valid for one year and will have an expiration date printed on it. If an applicant is not certified within one year, the test must be repeated.

The passing score for the exam is 80. Applicants are advised that they will need access to an updated copy of the Massachusetts General Laws to complete the exam successfully.

A non-refundable fee of \$50.00, made payable to the MTCA, must be submitted with the application. This examination is offered twice yearly – during the months of January and July. Application forms for the examination are available at all MTCA conferences and from the administrator, Barbara LaBombard -

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
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


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
