# **BEACON HILL REPORT** by Thomas Joyce, Esq.

I am pleased to report that formal session for the 2013 -2014 biennial legislative session concluded at 1:35 AM on Friday, August 1<sup>st</sup>. While a flurry of bills was sent to the Governor before the session ended, importantly none adversely affected the MTCA.

Although the Governor's folks were working feverishly to get scores of so called legacy bills enacted covering a broad array of subjects, we were successful in stopping a bill which would have permitted the executive branch to set a fee of \$25.00 or more for vital records to be collected by Clerks and directing any amount in excess of \$20.00 to be delivered to the Commonwealth. By way of reference you may recall that we were successful in defeating a similar bill last year shortly after I first came on board.

On another related note your Legislative Committee, chaired by Bob Cutler, met on July 22nd along with Vice President Andy Dowd, Second Vice President Jeremy Gillis, committee Vice Chair Diane Packer, other committee members and myself to discuss the vital records issue and begin the process of developing a legislative agenda for next year.

Please note, as we ponder bills to introduce in January, we are following a session where four of our six bills became law. To be certain a tremendous achievement, perhaps even unprecedented! Also, not to be overlooked, new joint legislative committees at the State House will be appointed in late January. At the very least we can expect new Chairs of the Election Laws Committee as Senator Finegold is seeking statewide office and Representative Murphy, after a hugely successful term at the helm may be appointed to oversee new challenges by the Speaker.

After legislative elections this fall we can probably expect to see at least 25 new legislators next year. Also expect newly elected Senate President Stan Rosenberg from Amherst to begin his reign leading the Senate. Additionally, we shall see many leadership changes in the beginning of the new year.

As we enjoy the remainder of the summer I would be remiss if I did not thank you and particularly the MTCA Legislative Committee for all the support and hard work. I look forward to working with Chairman Cutler and the entire committee next session.

# MASSACHUSETTS TOWN CLERKS' ASSOCIATION OFFERS CONFERENCE SCHOLARSHIPS! By Andy Dowd

In August 2008 the MTCA Executive Board voted to create scholarship funding for the MTCA conferences for municipal clerks who may have trouble obtaining financing from their communities to attend the MTCA conferences. This is completely separate from the NEMCI &A scholarships!

The Massachusetts Town Clerk's Association holds three conferences annually in three different locations across the state in order to make attendance as easy as possible for the greatest number of municipal clerks in an effort to provide guidance and education to our membership. The MTCA Mission is "The MTCA shall be dedicated to the purposes of increasing the proficiency of Town Clerks and other local government officials, of strengthening the quality of local government through professionalism, and of promoting recognition of the importance of the office of the Town Clerk."

The application and criteria are printed below and will be available prior to each conference. If you can meet the criteria and hope to attend the Fall Conference in October, please fill out the application and send it to <a href="mailto:the MTCA">the MTCA</a> Scholarship Chair Andrew T. #### MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

- 1. The Executive Board shall determine, annually, the amount of scholarship monies to be allocated. Scholarships are only for those applicants who have been denied funds from their municipalities.
- 2. It shall be the Scholarship Committee chaired by the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President that shall award the scholarships.
- 3. Scholarship awards will be limited to one person per office with the Clerk having first preference.
- 4. Applicant must be a Town Clerk or Assistant Town Clerk.
- 5. An applicant must be a member of the MTCA.
- 6. An applicant must have requested funds from his/her municipality and include a letter of denial for such funds.
- 7. The deadline for filing an application with the 1ST Vice President shall be 30 days prior to conference.
- 8. Applicants within a 50 mile radius scholarship may consist of registration fee, lunch, and banquet. Applicants outside a 50 mile radius scholarship may consist of registration, meals and hotel accommodations if requested.
- 9. Applicants are encouraged to find a roommate prior to applying for a scholarship. Applicants requesting a single room rate may be required to show justification
- 10. Preference will be given to first time applicants.
- 11. MTCA Scholarship application and information provided is confidential.




